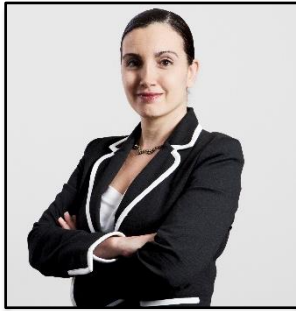
Sandra Idrovo

Dr Debbie Haski-Leventhal is an Associate Professor in Management at Macquarie Graduate School of Management (MGSM) and the Program Director of the Master of Social Entrepreneurship. As a scholar on corporate social responsibility (CSR), Debbie initiated and led the MGSM CSR Partnership Network, a network of leading Australian and international companies, nonprofits and governmental departments aimed at developing an evidence-based dialogue on CSR. Debbie has conducted many studies on CSR and published vastly on the topic and she is the author of the book *Strategic CSR: Theories and tools for responsible management*. She was a consultant to United Nations Volunteers, co-writing the *State of the World's Volunteerism Report*. She is also highly involved with the United Nation Principles for Responsible Management Education (PRME), annually conducting international studies on MBA students and their attitudes towards responsible management education. These studies are often covered by the media, including the *New York Times* and *Financial Review*.

Dr. Jennifer S. A. Leigh holds the Kilian J. and Caroline F. Schmitt Endowed Chair and is a Professor of Management at Nazareth College in Rochester, NY, USA. She received her PhD in organization studies from the Carroll School of Management at Boston College. Her scholarship addresses responsible management education, grand challenges, cross-sector social partnerships and social innovation. She is a recipient of the Mid-Career Distinguished Educator Award (2016) from Management and Organizational Behavior Teaching Society (MOTBS). She is also a co-recipient of the Fritz Roethlisberger Award for best article of the year in the *Journal of Management Education* (2010) and the New Educator Award (2008) from MOBTS. She co-edited the book *Educating for Responsible Management: Putting Theory into Practice* with Roz Sunley (2016). Jennifer is a Senior Editor for *The Annual Review of Social Partnerships (ARSP)* and an Associate Editor of the *Journal of Management Education* and *Business Ethics: A European Review (BEER)*.
